

Well, actually, a number of the club members decided to check out a rumor that the Handel's Ice Cream shop located fairly close to our meeting place has very good ice cream.



Technical Tip

This Tech Tip is borrowed from the Northern Illinois Regional Group's Newsletter ("Road Chatter," August, 2008)

"Member George Zulas found that the perfect container for soaking a battery cable end to remove corrosion is an empty Yoplait yogurt container! Just mix a solution of baking soda and water in the cup, place the end of the battery cable inside, and soak until all corrosion has been removed. The cup is the perfect size for the cable end, its inverted shape helps prevent tipping over and spills, and the lip makes it easy for the cable to hang on."

Crisp Watermelon Salsa

This light, mild salsa recipe is perfect for taking advantage of late summer's ripe and juicy watermelons.

Servings: 8 **INGREDIENTS**

3 cups watermelon, pre-cubed and seeded

2 Anaheim peppers, seeded and chopped

- 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped
- 1/4 cup lime juice

1/3 cup red onion, minced

- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons fresh mint leaves, finely chopped

1/2 teaspoon sugar **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl and stir well.
- Let chill in the refrigerator for at least 2 hours to allow flavors to blend. Serve with tortilla chips.

Tip: Anaheim peppers, also called California green peppers, are mild, sweet peppers that can be purchased fresh or canned from most supermarkets. You can also substitute another mild pepper, like Poblano chilies or canned green chilies. If you want to give your salsa more kick, try using spicy jalapeño peppers instead.


Dear Sheila : A car stalling after being driven a short distance can be caused by a variety of faults with the engine. Start by checking that there is no debris in the fuel line. If it is clear, check the vacuum pipes and hoses on the intake manifold and also check all grounding wires. If none of these approaches solves the problem, it could be that the fuel pump itself is faulty, causing low delivery pressure to the carburetor float chamber. I hope this helps. -Walter
