Minutes From the Meeting of September 19, 2008

SAVE YOUR THREADS

If you have built some mechanical things in your time, you have probably had more than one experience when the threads on a fastener, engine part or chassis component have become galled, bound or stripped. There are several reasons this happens – debris in the threads, tight tolerances, or simply forcing fasteners that are misaligned. It seems to be most common with chrome or stainless steel parts, but can also occur with plain steel.

To save time and money, you should always run a tap, die or thread chaser over and through any threaded item before assembly, especially if it is a new chrome or stainless part. Then apply a thread anti-seize compound liberally to both threaded surfaces before attempting to assemble them. All engine and car builders use this method to ensure a problem-free build.
