MINUTES FOR THE MEETING OF MAY 18, 2007

The Meeting was called to order by president Foster Buchtel at 7:30 p.m. Minutes from the April 2007 Meeting were approved as reported in the May Headliner. Foster announced that the June meeting would be held in the Stow City Building rather than the Stow Safety Building. Same time, different building. Alex and Debbie Stall were thanked for organizing the Hartville outing and dinner, and Jeep and Georgene Iacobucci were also recognized and thanked for conducting the Third Annual Presque Isle, PA tour that, this year, included fun at the new casino. Dave Duda described the Ohio Tour scheduled for June 16, starting with an 8 a.m. breakfast at the WANDLE House in Brewster (Rt. 93, on the west side immediately south of the railroad overpass, parking in the rear). Jeep Iacobucci reminded the members of the Nifty Fifties Annual Car Show at Ursuline College in Pepper Pike, OH, on June 24. Foster reminded the members to start thinking of what flathead-related items, as well as items that would interest the ladies, they can donate for the auction to be conducted by Bill Holland at the September meeting; he also announced that Bill Cassidy will be giving a presentation on Ford memorabilia at the November meeting.

Treasurer Ann Davis reported that the NORG checking account is still positive and the C.D. is still collecting interest. Georgene lacobucci, Headliner Editor, reported that to e-mailing the Headliner to members with e-mail addresses facilitated its distribution and allowed the recipients to have the benefit of color photographs. Membership Chair Dick Deyling and Sunshine Chair Ruth Canankamp had nothing to report. In response to a question, Webmaster Don Clink explained how to download the newsletter from the Internet. Pat Rooney reported that there were no SEMA issues of concern, and Historian Bill Royer reported that no history was made in the past month. The 1939 Dash Restoration Committee Chair, Ann Davis, is temporarily stalled on the project as she tries to locate the gauges. National President Craig Gorris reported on the National Board meeting scheduled for February 2008 in Ft. Myers, Florida at the Edison/Ford Estates, reminding the members that the Board meeting is open to all members. He also gave Foster a copy of the new, updated, EFV8CA "Regional Group Handbook." Craig reported that 250 cars are registered for the Eastern National Meet, 130 for the Central National Meet, and 300 for the Western National Meet. He also brought the group up to date on improvements underway for the National Web site and encouraged members to sign on.

The members were reminded of the 75th celebration of the '32 Ford & the Ford Flathead, a four-day even at Dearborn, Michigan, August 9 through 12, 2007.

Under New Business, Ron Mihalek invited the members to a Nifty Fifty's breakfast at the Mihalek's farm on County Line Rd., Sunday, May 20.

After the members thanked Ruth Canankamp for providing the cookies and coffee for the evening, the meeting was officially adjourned at 8:32 p.m., and the evening's speaker, Ken Canankamp gave a presentation on "The Eastern National Meet: Getting Ready, Getting There, and Getting Judged." In addition to good advice on what to carry when driving your flathead to a meet (with other suggestions from the audience), Ken distributed copies of the judging sheets and provided a thorough and helpful review of the judging process.

In case you haven't been to the pump lately, the price of gas is on the rise.


It seems like prices always jump right before summer. Of course, that's when most of us want to take a vacation


A Map is provided in the newsletter.

6 strawberries, sliced


