




Joint Visit with Nifty Fifties Ford Club to the Cleveland Botanical Gardens

Lemon Chicken Breasts

½ Cup Flour

1 Tbsp. lemon pepper seasoning

1 Tsp Kosher Salt

2 Lemons Divided

1 lb. Boneless Chicken Breasts Halved

2 Tbsp. Virgin Olive Oil

½ Cup Chicken Broth

2 Tbsp. Butter

2 Garlic Cloves Minced

Preheat oven to 400. In medium bowl whisk flour, lemon, salt, zest of 1 lemon. Toss chicken breasts in flour mixture until coated. Slice remaining lemon into thin rounds.

In a large skillet over high heat, heat oil, add chicken and cook until golden brown flip over and repeat, add chicken broth, butter, garlic, lemon slices.

Bake until chicken is thoroughly cooked (15 minutes) reduce heat.

Spoon sauce over chicken and serve with noodles, rice or mashed potatoes and your choice of vegetable
