Lakeside provided food and drinks to all people that attended and requested an "at will" donation to be donated to the Hattie Larlham Foundation.


Hattie Larlham is a 60 year old not-for-profit disability service organization providing care and support to children and adults throughout Ohio.

Shortbread Cookies

This is the recipe for the FORD cookies served at last month's meeting. The recipe is from Karen Mihalek and will always have a special place in my heart and cookbook. Hope you enjoy them as Karen always says "YUN YUM"

Shortbread Cookies

¾ Cups Powdered Sugar1 Cup Butter1/4 Tsp Baking Powder

1 Tsp Vanilla 2 Cups Flour

Beat butter & Vanilla until Fluffy. Gradually add sugar and beat until creamy. Add flour and baking powder to create smooth dough.

Roll or pat into a 1/3" thick dough. Cut into squares. If you prefer sprinkle with sugar or push a "Ford Logo" into the soft dough. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 300 for 30 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from oven and cool
