Member **Gene Saunders** distributed an interesting handout on the Arduin overhead valve conversion kit for flathead V8s. While most of us think of the Arduin heads as something found on race cars, the heads were originally developed to boost the horsepower of flathead V8 powered trucks that were used to haul coal out of coal mines in Tennessee. The flathead V8s did not have enough power to haul heavy loads of coal up out of the mines, so Henry Ford hired Zora Arkus-Duntov to create overhead conversion kits to boost the horsepower. The Arduin heads really did their job--they raised the engines' horsepower from 85-90 to 175. Race fans soon adopted the heads for their flathead powered race cars. It is estimated that there are only about 50 sets of these heads existing today. There probably are more, but they are sitting forgotten in people's garages and barns--waiting to be discovered by lucky flathead fans.

We adjourned at 9:10 p.m.


