## **Minutes from the N.O.R.G. Meeting, March 15, 2013**

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 p.m. by president Jeep Iacobucci. New members Dan and Diane Francis were introduced. They are the proud owners of a 1941 Ford pickup. Welcome to NORG!

President Jeep invited all members to reintroduce themselves to the club and remind everyone of the year and make of their cars. Jeep thanked Bruce and Marie Lewicki for tonight's coffee and cupcakes (with green frosting to celebrate St. Patrick's Day).

Program chairperson Rich Jandrey introduced Bill Witt, our speaker for the March meeting. Bill owns Ohio Blasting Equipment & Media, located at 144 W. Wilbeth Road in Akron. Bill presented many interesting and useful facts and ideas regarding media blasting. He pointed out that if you are using 100 psi air pressure when you are blasting, the media leaves the nozzle of the blasting gun at about 500 miles per hour. The friction of the media against the metal being blasted therefore generates a considerable amount of heat and can easily warp sheet metal. It is important to know the type of metal and the type of paint or amount of rust you are trying to remove in order to avoid doing damage. He discussed the various types of media that are available and gave advice on what type of media works best for what purposes. Soda blasting has become popular recently, but the soda must be thoroughly cleaned off the metal after the blasting is finished because the high ph. of the soda will cause problems in paint adhesion if it is not neutralized and removed. Bill discussed some of the OSHA regulations that have affected the media blasting business and noted that these regulations apply to hobbyists as well as to commercial blasters. One of the more interesting regulations is something called the "Fugitive Dust Law," which forbids outdoor blasting. After an extensive question and answer session the club thanked Bill for his very informative presentation. Following Bill's presentation president Jeep started the business meeting by calling for a reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. Secretary Ginny Herrmann was absent, so pinch hitter Neal Garland read the minutes. Annette Gorris proposed one correction, which was that the coffee and cookies for the previous meeting were provided by Foster Buchtel and Neal Garland. Bill Royer moved that the amended minutes be accepted, seconded by Joe Wasielewski. The minutes were accepted as amended.

Treasurer Anne Davis reported that there has been no big change in our financial condition, probably. Membership chairperson Craig Gorris informed us that only one of our "old" members has not yet paid dues for 2013. Rosters for 2013 have been distributed to all members and new members have received their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary pins.

Sunshine chairperson Loretta Duda was absent, but Georgene Iacobucci noted that a get well card has been sent to Dan Herrmann.

Headliner Editor Annette Gorris proposed that the club allow her to print out the newsletter in color at home to send to members who do not have computers instead of having the Headliner copied in black and white for mailing as is currently being done. She also asked permission to buy large size envelopes for mailing the Headliner instead of using the tape tabs she has been using. Simply folding the newsletter and sealing it with the tabs often results in newsletters getting torn in the mail. Rich Jandrey suggested that the club should pay for color ink for the home printing. Anne Davis moved that the club approve these changes. Second by Bill Royer. The motion passed.

Activities chairperson Neal Garland announced that we will have our first mini outing for this year by gathering at Mike's Place restaurant in Kent, Ohio, on Tuesday, March 19. These outings are intended to be informal come-if-you-feel-like-it opportunities to get together for lunch and tire kicking.

Mike's Place is located at the intersection of State Route 43 and State Route 261 in Kent. Plan to arrive at 11:00a.m.

Webmaster Regis Schilling asked if he should include information about the club's mini outings on the website. Members felt this would be a good idea.

Historian Bill Royer distributed name tags he had prepared for new members and encouraged all members to wear their name tags to club meetings. He noted that the label tapes for the club's label maker is no longer available. Bruce Lewicki has a more modern label maker that he is willing to loan to the club.

President Jeep and Foster Buchtel presented Bill Royer with a plaque expressing the club's appreciation for his service as the club's historian. Bill has held this position for more than 30 years and has done an excellent job of preserving and cataloging the club's newsletters and other documents. Regis Schilling announced that many of these documents will be put into electronic media form to make their preservation easier.

Jeep noted that we currently have no volunteer for coffee and cookies for the July meeting. Please consider taking on this job for the club. Those who are not able to bake cookies are encouraged to make a donation to the club's coffee fund to help pay for coffee and cookie supplies.

Frank Posar brought us up to date on the tour to Dearborn, Michigan, planned with the Nifty Fifties and the Illinois V8 group on August 22-24. A tour of an Air Force museum has been added to Friday's schedule. Frank also noted that a new person has been found to put club emblems on shirts and jackets. More information will be provided at the April meeting.

Rich Jandrey moved that we adjourn. Second by Regis Schilling. We adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

### Technical Tip ~ Replacement 50# Oil Pressure Sending Unit

Many of us own pre-1946 vehicles that require a 50# oil pressure sending unit. These sending units are difficult to find and when you do locate one it is usually very expensive. A perfect substitute is this sending unit, originally manufactured for the Willys Jeep. The unit is available and costs only \$27.95 plus shipping. It will require you to use a 1/4" to 1/8" pipe fitting to adapt it to your engine.


Sweet Dreams and Walking After Midnight...27 songs in all. The show's title was inspired by Cline's letters to Seger, which were consistently signed

**Thursday, April 25:** Our outing for April will be a repeat of our visit to the Cathedral Buffet in Cuyahoga Falls. It will take place on Thursday, April 25. If you made it to this outing last year, you will remember that the Buffet provides a really great buffet lunch for \$7.05 plus tax. This includes a salad bar, a main course bar, and a dessert bar—and drinks. After finishing our buffet lunch last year we visited the Bomb Shelter—a very interesting antique/junk store in Akron. I will bring directions to the Bomb Shelter to the Cathedral Buffet lunch for anyone who might want to make a return visit to the Bomb Shelter. Directions to the buffet are included below. Plan to arrive by 11:00 a.m.

**Directions From Akron:** Take 1-77 north to Route 8 north. Exit Route 8 at the Portage Trail exit (exit 5B). Turn Left on Portage Trail. Follow Portage Trail all the way to State Road. You will know you are approaching State Road when you see a huge empty lot where a new shopping center is being constructed, although there is not much there except dirt and earth moving equipment right now. Turn left on State Road. Turn right at the first traffic light after you get on State Road. This will put you in the Cathedral Buffet's parking lot

**Directions from Cleveland:** Take Route 8 south and exit at the Graham Road. Turn right on Graham Road and follow it all the way to State Road. Turn left on State Road. The first traffic light you will come to after getting on State Road will be at the intersection of State Road and Portage Trail. Keep going straight on State Road. Turn right at the second traffic light on State Road. This will put you in the Cathedral Buffet's parking lot.

### Judging Changes for Rouge Class - effective in 2012

*From the Judging Standards Committee*

#### Proposal 1

There are some changes I would like you to consider relative to the Rouge Class. First off, because of the brief nature of the Rouge judging form, (if you haven't seen it, there are 3 yes/no questions) there is no place for the car owner to sign the sheet. This has led to car owners being ignored during the judging process and many times not knowing their car had been judged until they returned from their own judging duties. The owner is then blindsided at the awards banquet when he finds his car failed to meet with the judge's approval of originality in one or more of the categories when the award is announced. In my opinion this is unjust.

*This was passed. The Judges will now be required to speak to the owner of Rouge entries as they are now required to speak to other Concours judged entries. The Rouge judging form will be changed to include a space for the owner to sign the form after consultation with the deputy.*

#### Proposal 2

Another issue is drivability. The newest Rouge cars will be 58 years old in 2012. Because of the brittle nature of some of the original wiring, I would like to propose some consideration for replacing old wiring that has lost its insulation.

*This change to the Rouge Class for "Allowable Replacement Parts" was approved. The Judging Manual will be updated and incorporated into the printed version in the Roster. A statement that the "Minimum amount of wiring be replaced to ensure dependable operation and drivability is allowed." will accompany this. This is intended to discourage wholesale changing of all wiring and looms. The JSC Secretary will change the Rouge Judging form.*

## RASPBERRY CREAM CHEESE COFFEE CAKE

(PICTURED ABOVE)

Since this recipe calls for raspberry jam and not fresh raspberries, you can make this coffee cake any time of year and bring a touch of spring to your table.

**2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour**

**3/4 cup sugar**

**3/4 cup cold butter**

**1/2 teaspoon baking powder**

**1/2 teaspoon baking soda**

**1/2 teaspoon salt**

**3/4 cup sour cream**

**1 egg, beaten**

**1-1/2 teaspoons almond extract**

**FILLING:**

**1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened**

**1/2 cup sugar**

**1 egg**

**1/2 cup raspberry jam**

**1/2 cup slivered almonds**

- 1 In a large mixing bowl, combine flour and sugar. Cut in butter until mixture is crumbly. Remove 1 cup and set aside. To remaining crumbs, add baking powder, baking soda, salt, sour cream, egg and almond extract;

mix well. Spread in the bottom and 2 in. up the sides of a greased 9-in. springform pan.

- 2 For filling, combine the cream cheese, sugar and egg in a small mixing bowl; beat well. Spoon over batter. Top with raspberry jam. Sprinkle with almonds and reserved crumb mixture.
- 3 Bake at 350° for 55-60 minutes. Cool on a wire rack for 15 minutes. Carefully run a knife around edge of pan to loosen. Remove sides of the pan. Cool completely. Store in the refrigerator.

**Yield:** 12 servings.
