

Fallingwater

Regular Tour \$17.50



You will become aware of the rhythmic interplay between interior and exterior space by the numerous terraces, open-air walkways and unexpected views of the trees and water as you move through the house on this guided experience. This tour features all the major rooms of the house and lasts approximately one hour.

Here are a few tips to help make your visit more enjoyable

There is a 1/4-mile gradual downhill walk outdoors from the Visitors Center to Fallingwater. Limited van transportation is available for visitors who are unable to make this walk.

Comfortable walking shoes are a must!

There are no public restroom facilities at Fallingwater itself. Please use the facilities at the Visitors Pavilion before beginning your tour.

Fallingwater is a multi-storied house with over 100 steps from the first level to the guesthouse on top of the hill. Because the house is a museum with original furniture intact as left by the Kaufmann family, there are no places to sit down once the tour has started. If you do not wish to climb to the higher floors, simply tell your tour guide that you would like to leave the tour after visiting the main floor/living room area.

Other pointers:

- Leave backpacks and large purses in the car
- Eating, drinking, and chewing gum are not permitted in the house
- Fallingwater is a smoke-free environment
- Visitors are asked not to touch the woodwork or collections or sit on/touch the furnishings.
- Cell phones must be turned off for the tour
- Photography is not permitted.
- Van Transportation is available. Information at Visitors Center
